September is National Library Card Sign-Up Month, an annual campaign for libraries nationwide. The campaign's roots go back to 1987 and then Secretary of Education William Bennett. Secretary Bennett stated "Let's have a campaign. . . Every child should obtain a library card and use it."

The American Library Association accepted the challenge, with support from the National Commission on Libraries and Information Science and a grant from the Reader's Digest Foundation. The campaign kicked off on the Mall in Washington D.C. with 500 children in attendance. The following year, September was declared Library Card sign up month and libraries have been celebrating ever since.

Most years, the library staff would use our time at the Hancock County Fair to share the benefits of a library card with our community. This year, I'm asking for your help. As our over 30,000 card holders know, the library can bring a world of resources to your fingertips. Tell your friends about the great book you checked out from the library. Let your neighbor know you found a great selection for family movie night from our collection. Give your co-worker a nudge to try our digital audiobooks for their commute.

Finally, if you're one of our lucky cardholders, take a picture with your library card and tag us on social media: #FHCPLShowUsYourCard. With your help we can go beyond the original goal of every child to every member of our community as a library cardholder.

Hand sanitizer is available for your use in many locations throughout the library.




## In accordance with the Governor's Order, masks are REQUIRED.

Because we can only allow a limited number of patrons in the building at a time, we ask that you limit your time so that all patrons who wish to visit may do so.




## Children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult
